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## EU port services regulation

- Open market for port services
- Financial transparency in case of public funding
- Social dialogue or social paragraph
- Proces: trilog (EP, Transport council and EC) under Dutch EU presidency

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#### EU fair competition

- There is no fair competition:
- Millions of state aid each year in Flemish and German ports
- EC refuses to produce state aid guidelines for ports
- On the contrary...

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## Corporate taxation

- EC forces the Netherlands to levy corporate tax from ports while no other port in Europe effectively pays corporate tax
- Thereby deliberately causing a more unlevel playing field
- How should Dutch politics respond?



## Freight policy

- There are a lot of mono-modal policy documents
- Few multi-modal and hardly any focussed an freight
- Therefore we are now working on a multi-modal freight policy document
- What are the future innovations that will change freight logistics?
- How will this affect infrastructural developments and investments?

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
