Aims:	<p>The main objective of this workshop is to equip EUR/ERIM researchers who are going to submit for EU H2020 Collaborative projects with specific knowledge how to deal with each requirement of the Impact section of the H2020 proposal template. At the end of the workshop the researchers:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Have an overview of the EC policy background of Impact within H2020 and the shift in focus (in evaluation, programming compared to FP7);</li> <li>2. Have an overview of the most frequent made comments on this evaluation criterium in the Evaluation Summary Reports (ESRs);</li> <li>3. Have a good overview how to start up the preparation process;</li> <li>4. Know the requirements of section 2 Impact, the questions behind the requirements and have best practice examples/ handles/practical suggestion to be used for their own proposal writing and preparation process;</li> <li>5. Have insight to connect to/ search options for the policy background and higher EC impact aim that forms the background of the topic;</li> <li>6. Have an overview to compose a clear and attractive proposal abstract with Impact clearly stated;</li> <li>7. Have a clear overview ‘how’ their proposal will be evaluated on Impact.</li> </ol>
Workshop contents:	The workshop combines a practical “how to deal with” each requirement of section 2, with a focus on practical writing skills with a policy perspective of the developments on Impact and the H2020 evaluation process, highlighting the shift in focus within H2020 compared to its predecessor FP7. The aim is to provide

	<p>the submitter a broader overview of the context of his/her proposal and what to expect from the EC evaluation process.</p> <p>Dealing with the (new) requirements of the H2020 proposal template and the philosophy behind it will be the focus of this practical oriented workshop.</p>
Literature	The participants of the workshop will be given a specific handout on “How to Write the Impact”, a lessons learned document from earlier EUR submissions/ most frequent made comments in the Evaluation Summary Reports and an annotated H2020 proposal Template with writing tips per requirement.
